Forgiveness

One of the numerous gifts Jesus Christ has given you is this. He hopes on bringing all of us back, time after time, to the truths about life that we are all anxious not to see!!

So often people say, "forgiveness is a lovely idea", and particularly young people say that forgiveness is Christianity's greatest and most attractive truth. But almost in the same breath the same people will say, "but how can you forgive someone who acted in such a depraved way?"

This parable is stunningly clear, forgiveness works if you also forgive from your heart. This truth is repeated in the Lord's Prayer, 'forgive us our sins as we forgive those who are against us!

So, may I end this short reflection with a question to you? Is it the case that this parable and the Lord's Prayer state that forgiveness is only offered on these terms – 'Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had or on you? Matthew 18.33. Or is forgiveness always given, irrespective of your willingness to forgive others?
