Weekly Letter – 21 January 2024

Mark 1.14-20 and Psalm 62.5-12

I'm sure you have time to read Psalm 62, verses 5-12! This bright and upbeat section begins with, 'Yes, my soul, finds rest in God, my hope comes from him ... My salvation and honour depend upon God ...'

In Jesus ' baptism, verses 9-11, it is clear that Jesus publically states that he is 'dead' to a false life, and so chooses to be filled with God's life. (We need to hold on to the fact that Jesus is both fully human and divine). In this decision, we are beginning to see what Mark meant when he states Jesus is, "The Son of God", that is, Jesus of Nazareth (a fully human being) is completely reconciled to accepting the life the Father gives him. Or, put this way, Jesus of Nazareth has let go of all self-concern, and in the words of the psalmist chooses, lives, and proclaims, "My salvation and honour depend upon the divine".

This is the person we meet in the gospels – a person who knows and experiences the joy of turning to God. This is the man who speaks to four locals. And I'm not surprised these four business men in today's gospel reading, Simon, Andrew, James and John jumped at Jesus' invitation to join him in sharing 'The Good News' with others – for they see the Divine in this man – Jesus of Nazareth.

Let us pray that our lives reveal our choice to depend upon God, to rest in God and to live a life which reveals the joy of turning to God.
