**God ‘understands everything and
therefore is able to forgive everything’**

This well known ‘story’ from Jesus cannot be used to say you either go to hell or heaven. For sure Jesus often uses dramatic language to cause people to think, to challenge them and awaken their hearts to greater truths of his father. In other words, to treat every sentence ‘literally’ does not reflect accurately and honestly Jesus’ message to the world.

When we read about the rich man’s disappointing choices, I sense it would be wiser not to think of his choices, but more honestly think of where we have ‘gone astray’. For we do harm through our vulnerability, carelessness, anxiety or even dare I write this – our stupidity. Often we do not act with malice intent, but sometimes we have acted deliberately. However our knowledge of the Christian faith honestly shows we are not beyond forgiveness. Why? Because God ‘understands everything and is also the One who can forgive everything’.

To acknowledge this truth. To proclaim this truth. To live within this truth is to know that Jesus continues to triumph. ‘For the Kingdom of heaven is within you’.
