As with John the Baptist and the future disciples, Peter and Andrew, you too have experienced the gift that Jesus Christ is the 'One'.

Perhaps today it is a good time to remember that God has found you. In all your different ways, you have 'fallen for' your creator, the source for being your true self.

For on a particular occasion, or over a period of time, God seized your imagination, your understanding and in many ways your heart. As you began to walk with God, you began to understand why life is given, and step by step it has been revealed to you how you can and ought to live your life.

At times, being faithful to your experience of finding God has been difficult to make sense of.
