Luke 18.9-14

Jesus knows how to push his luck with the well respected Pharisees!! His point however is clear. At times we are far too easily satisfied with ourselves. I would be the first to admit this, and therefore it's easy to make excuses. So people say, "I don't hurt anyone. I get on with my neighbours. I phone my Mum most days and I try to be a law abiding citizen!" If we think like this, then in reality we are in the same boat as this Pharisee in Jesus' parable.

Not only can we be rather satisfied with ourselves we can also excuse ourselves, because we are not really to blame, or there are some extenuating circumstances, and so in our prayers we can rather too easily leave bits out! Perhaps in our prayers it might be a good idea to remember that God knows all the excuses!

The real point of this short parable is to truly believe in the forgiveness of sins, as clearly the tax collector does.

Real forgiveness of sins means we face what we have done, without any excuses, or extenuating circumstances, and like the tax-collector acknowledge all the horror, meanness, and destructiveness of what we have thought, said or done. Being honest will show God, that you really do believe in forgiveness, and that we know we can always receive forgiveness from God, if we ask for it.

We are unbelievably fortunate!
